## Program Outcomes

MCC's Accounting A.S. degree prepares you for employment in an entry-level accounting position or to further your studies toward a 4-year degree.

Since our Accounting program is accredited by the ACBSP, after completing the degree you will have a solid foundation in Accounting and Business Studies. This prepares you to seamlessly transfer to a 4-year college or university to continue your education.
